Gower Gin Win Sustainable Business Award 2022

Sustainability is at the heart of Gower Gin company, and we were delighted to be awarded Sustainable Business of the year at the inaugural Wales Food and Drink Awards 2022. This award reflects our passion as a team to constantly think about what changes we can make throughout our whole processes, from sourcing our botanicals to our plastic free packaging. At our distillery in Port Eynon we use green energy, and we have a reverse osmosis machine which allows us to produce our own purified water. When it comes to the final product, we have recently switched to a lighter bottle which is made up of 60% recycled content. The alcohol we use is Soil Association organic, and we also offer the option to purchase our gins in closed-loop recycling refill pouches.

Within our last issue of Bwyd Abertawe e-News, there was a short article about Community Supported Agriculture (CSA), which inspired Cae Felin (CSA) to give a little update on their **story so far...**

Founded by Rob Hernando in 2020 Cae Felin aims to provide inclusive access to nature for communities in the North East of Swansea, by creating therapeutic volunteering opportunities, which re-connect residents to their local environment. In a groundbreaking collaboration with Swansea Bay University Health Board a 7 acre field, (just a stone-fruit's throw from Morriston Hospital) is being transformed into a stunning location, where wildlife and people can thrive in harmony. Restored hedgerows, wildflower meadows, and a new orchard will be the backdrop for community growing, socialising and celebrating diversity. We welcome everyone, of whatever age, ability or background to join us in a quest to make high quality fresh food available for all, to care for nature, to build community and grow delicious fruit and vegetables. Our first public tree planting day was 4th Feb, see photos above. Volunteers helped on the day - improving habitat for Dormice, Voles, Hedgehogs, bugs, birds, bees and other beautiful beasties...


Swansea City Conference

FareShare Cymru is a food redistribution charity covering South and West Wales whose mission is to fight hunger and tackle food waste - two of the biggest social and environmental issues the world is currently facing.

Food becomes surplus when it can no longer be sold. This could be due to packaging errors, passing its best-before date, or simply because it doesn't look right, despite the fact it is perfectly good to eat!

By redistributing this food to charity and community groups, it can be used in projects tailored to a community's needs - meaning the most vulnerable in society have access to healthy and nutritious food that would otherwise go to waste.

FareShare also asks that the groups they work with provide a 'more than food' service. This means that they provide a service that benefits its users - these range from volunteering opportunities, cooking classes, budgeting advice, and more. Free Group Training



Now you can access free group training from Good Food

<u>Oxfordshire</u> (GFO) for your organisation or group. The training is designed for you to do as a group in person, using our training videos.

Healthy Start is a national government scheme, including Wales, which provides money through a payment card to eligible people who are pregnant or who have young children. That money can be used to buy milk, vegetables, pulses and formula. There are also free vitamins available. This session goes through the details of the scheme, will help you gain an understanding of the barriers many people face when it comes to accessing and using their Healthy Start card, and equip you to support them to overcome these barriers.
